Seacoast Utility Authority has a grease waste prevention program as mandated by Palm Beach County Environmental Control Rule No. 1 and Seacoast Utility Authority's Sewer Service Policy.

All non-residential food preparation facilities and all other facilities generating wastewater with grease and/or oil concentration must have a grease interceptor to intercept the grease and/or oil waste prior to discharge into the Authority's sanitary sewer system. Location and type of grease interceptor used must be approved, in writing, by Authority and applicable regulatory agencies. Grease interceptors must be properly maintained by customer or owner. Design and maintenance of grease interceptor must be in accordance with Palm Beach County Environmental Control Rule 1, and shall conform to the specifications and requirement of the Authority. If grease and/or oil in excess of allowable amounts, in accordance with Authority's and regulatory agency requirements, is discharged, Authority shall inform operator and/or owner of premises to properly maintain, repair, or replace, if necessary, said grease interceptor. Failure to cease discharging wastewater with grease and/or oil concentrations shall be cause for discontinuance of the water and sewer service.

All existing non-residential and master metered food preparation and/or related facilities must have an approved grease interceptor installed to provide protection from possible grease and/or oil entering into the wastewater system. In accordance with the above stated regulations, the applicant hereby acknowledges receipt of the Seacoast Utility Authority Construction Standards and Specifications Drawing No. 55, 56, 57 & 59, section IV page 25, 26, 27, 28 & 29 which indicates the approved method of installation, and Property Questionnaire.

Installation, design, and inspection of the grease interceptor is required prior to obtaining permanent water and sewer service. The applicant is responsible for all fees and the design and the installation of the grease interceptor. The applicant/owner shall submit a completed Property Questionnaire and two sets of engineering drawings to Seacoast Utility Authority for approval. Following proper notice, Seacoast will perform the required inspections upon delivery of the grease interceptor and after installation of the grease interceptor. Upon successful final inspection, the applicant hereby acknowledges and accepts responsibility for subsequent maintenance and acknowledges Seacoast Utility Authority's right to enter onto applicant's property to inspect grease interceptor on a regular basis.

I hereby acknowledge that I am the Owner or I am authorized to act on behalf of the Owner of the property to be served. I acknowledge that the temporary water service will be disconnected without further notice if the required grease interceptor has not been installed and passed final Seacoast inspection within sixty (60) days of this signed agreement.
